Science Abroad

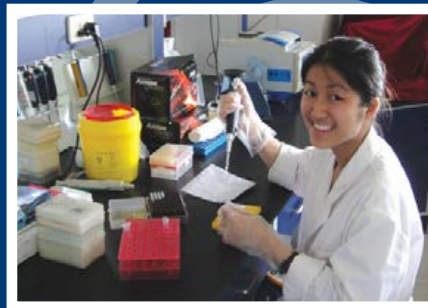
INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH LABS

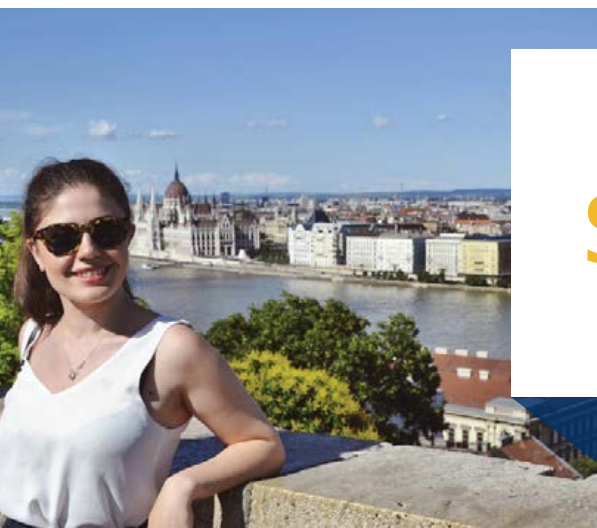
